The Irish Shows Association would highly recommend that all Animal Owners who have their Animals Insured to have the Insurance Cover extended to cover them while showing animals at Shows. It may cost very little or nothing at all depending on who you have Insurance Cover with.

The reason for giving this recommendation is that if your animal were to injure someone or damage someone's property and it is established that your animal was out of control at that time, you may be held responsible or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused, and may end up paying all or part of any settlement reached.

All riders should wear appropriate head gear, which complies with up to date Safety Standards complying under the Directive 89/686/EEC on personal protective equipment as described by the HSA.

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND RULES**

- Entries close on <u>Friday</u>, <u>21st June 2024</u> and must be accompanied by correct entry fee.
- All entries are made to and accepted by the Bannow & Rathangan Show Society Company Limited.
- 3. Cheques, Postal Orders and all monies payable to Bannow & Rathangan Show Society.
- 4. All Exhibits to be presented as per allocated Ring times (see Schedule)
- 5. Rosettes, Cards and Badges of other Shows not allowed on any exhibit.
- 6. No second prize for less than three entries and no third prize for less than five entries, no fourth prize for less than seven entries in any class. No prizes for one entry.
- 7. All horses shown in Riding Classes shall not be shown in hand except in the case of special prizes.
- 8. Neither the Company, Committee or Landowners will be responsible for any loss, accident or damage to any exhibit while at the show or in transit to or therefore. All entries are accepted at Owners risk.
  No claim for compensation arising out of the Show will be entertained, neither will liability be accepted for any accident to any exhibitor, his or her servants or to any spectator present.
- 9. The Show Committee reserve the right to abandon or postpone the Show or cancel or alter any class.
- No animal is eligible for entry in more than one Class except in the case of special prizes.
- 11. Exhibitors must satisfy themselves that their exhibits are in correct classes and bear correct number before judging commences.
- 12. All dogs must be on leads.
- 13. The decision of the Judges shall be final, and the instructions of stewards and officials must be obeyed at all times.
- 14. In the event of an appointed Judge not being available on day of show the committee reserves the right to appoint a Judge.
- 15. All Cups are Perpetual. The winner of any Cup shall be responsible to the Secretary for its safe custody and for production and delivery to the Society in the same condition in which it was received not later than 10th June, 2024.
- 16. All objections must be lodged with the Secretary within thirty minutes of the conclusion of the class or event concerned. No objection shall be accepted or considered by the Committee unless lodged before said time. Each objection shall be accompanied by a fee of €100 which will be retained if objection is over ruled.
- 17. Each Exhibitor or their agent shall be prepared to certify all statements in

- his or her Entry Form in any manner the Committee may require.
- 18. Prize winners may at the discretion of the Judges and/or the Committee be required to subject their animals to a Veterinary examination.
- 19. All foals must be adequately haltered and led, the Committee reserve the absolute right to have any foal removed from the Show Grounds and to forfeit their entry fee if not properly led and haltered.
- 20. All entries made by telephone must be followed by correct entry fee.
- 21. A 'Pass' covers free entry to the show for one person only.
- 22. 5% on all prize winners in horse, pony, cattle and sheep classes will be deducted from prize winners and forwarded to the I.S.A.
- 23. Prize money for all classes will be paid out on Show Day
- 24. Ages of Animals to be correctly stated on entry forms.
- 25. Cattle and Horses must be provided with sufficient halters and caretakers must be in attendance at all times during the day.
- 26. All animals to remain on Show Field until after 4 p.m.
- 27. All accidents/incidents to be reported to the Secretary.
- 28. Any animal out of box must be attended to.
- 29. Only one nomination to be won per Brood Mare, Horse / Pony in any one year, to be taken up by winning mare only and are non transferable.
- 30. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be on time for the judging of their class.
- 31. All exhibitors and persons admitted to the show and each entry shall be subject to the Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Society.
- 32. All riders should wear appropriate head gear, which complies with up to date Safety Standards.
- 33. Officers and Stewards of Bannow & Rathangan Show Society reserve the right to remove any animal that is considered a Health & Safety risk.
- 34. Exhibitors shall accept absolute responsibility in respect of the control and behaviour of their animals at the Show and shall provide halters for animals where appropriate. Exhibitors shall be solely responsible for all legal liability arising as a result of any injury or damage caused by any animal under their control to their property or the property of others at the Show.
- No person will be admitted to solicit money for the sale of tickets or otherwise in the Grounds of the Society, except from a stall, with the prior permission of the Committee.
- 36. All horses/ponies are required to have equine premises registration number from which the equine came and passport number/UELN number of the animal.

The I.S.A. are proud to present the following Championships and wishes to acknowledge the generous sponsorships which make these competitions possible. For the efficient running of the Championships all concerned are requested to read and observe the Rules set out below.

#### **General Rules for ISA Championships 2024**

Eligibility of Shows to host Qualifiers:

Shows wishing to participate in the Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must:

- Have collected the Championship Fund (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle, Sheep & Goat class prize money for the previous year and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of the show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable. Any show or competitor in breach of the rules set out will be disqualified from participating or competing in these Championships.
- 2. Undertake to ensure the correct collection and return of qualifier cards and entry fees.
- 3. These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

## Responsibility of Shows holding Qualifying Rounds:

- 1. Selected Shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
- 2. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
- 3. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
- 4. Shows may charge a set entry fee for each qualifying class. The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful exhibit(s) on appearance at the final.
- 5. No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifying class for that championship on the day of the final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association.

- 6. Shows who hold qualifiers for Horses, Ponies, Cattle, Sheep & Goats may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in at least one other class at their show on the day. Shows should not undertake to host a qualifier unless they have an equivalent class.
- 7. Where shows debar class winners from further competitions, this rule must not be applied to qualifiers.
- 8. Animals qualified for finals are not eligible to enter in any other show class at the show where the final is held, other than a qualifying class for another championship.
- Shows should appoint competent, well-briefed persons to act as stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and whose documentation is in order, are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- 10. On completion of judging, Stewards must inform the successful competitors to visit the Secretary's Office at the show within one hour and complete the necessary paperwork and pay for entry to the final.
- 11. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer who will be available at the Secretary's Office to assist exhibitors to complete the entry cards for participation in the final and collect the entry fee.
- 12. Show Secretaries must forward completed result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three days following the holding of the show.

NB. Shows must return results card marked "No Entry" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

#### **Responsibility of Exhibitors:**

- 1. Exhibitors accept that the Judge's decision is final in all cases.
- 2. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises, the matter should only be dealt with under 8 below.
- 3. Exhibitors should be familiar with the Irish Shows Association Disciplinary Policy as published on our website and annual guidebook.
- Winners of Qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their qualifiers (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with the rules above, within one hour of qualifying.
- 5. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- 6. The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsors reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of the competition as may be necessary where appropriate.
- 7. Shows and competitors must contact the ISA for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.
- 8. Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show and the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of judging, together with a fee of €50, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.

9. Any exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit is liable to disqualification and/or forfeiture of any prizes awarded.

#### Responsibilities of Shows hosting Championship Finals & All-Ireland Finals:

- Where shows are paying out prizes, a deduction of 5% of the prize money will be collected by the show and forwarded to the I.S.A. within 30 days of the Final.
- Championship finals must start not later than 2pm on the day of the show and the advertised time must be adhered to as far as possible. If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.
- Shows should cooperate with ISA personnel and judges appointed to officiate at finals.
- 4. Selection of judges for All-Ireland championships should be handled by the relevant sub-committee of the board of the ISA.

#### **New Rule for Exhibitors 2024**

If a qualified exhibitor does not turn up to an ISA final without giving prior notice to the ISA office or to a board member he or she will incur a financial penalty. general-rules

#### RECOMMENDATION FOR CATTLE CLASSES

After a number of submissions from affiliated shows on the judging of calves and the need to have them judged by weight rather than by age at Shows. The Irish Show Association Cattle Sub Committee have put forward the following recommendation on use of live weight for calf classes eg Calves under 12 months not to exceed 460kg; Autumn born calves and calves under 6 months should not exceed 320kg.

Another suggestion is to use no more than 1.7kg live weight gain per day from the birth date to the show date. This proposal would also be suitable for interbreed pedigree calf championships.

- 1. All exhibits for competition must be on show grounds by 11 a.m. and should be removed between 4-5 p.m. Claim card must be presented when reclaiming entries.
- 2. In each section, the number of prizes awarded will depend on the number of entries in each class. No third prize if not more than three exhibits.
- 3. An objection of any sort must be made in WRITING within one hour after the award of the Judges. No objection will be entertained by the Committee unless a sum of €30 is lodged with the Secretary, which will be refunded if the objection is sustained, otherwise it will be forfeited.
- There is no entry fee unless otherwise stated and ALL EXHIBITORS MUST PAY AT GATE.
- 5. Last date for entries is 21st June 2024. Photography must be entered before that date also, but photos must be brought on show day.
- 6. PLEASE NOTE this year that all prizes, including cups and special prizes to be collected when collecting your entry.
- 7. All exhibits must be exhibitors own work and all exhibitors must be amateurs.

#### **CUPS, TROPHIES & SPECIAL PRIZES**

- 1. The Cleary and Doyle Perpetual Cup will be presented to the exhibitor with the highest number of points in the Home Baking Section.
- The Carmel Breen Perpetual Cup will be presented to the exhibitor with the highest number of points in the Craft Section.
- 3. The Séan Furlong Memorial Trophy will be presented to the exhibitor with the most points in the Flower Classes.

# Department of Agriculture, Food and The Marine IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ORGANISERS OF SHOWS AND EXHIBITORS OF CATTLE 2024.

#### **SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - CATTLE**

Keepers wishing to show cattle in 2024 must obtain a Certificate of Compliance prior to the movement of the animal to the Show. This ensures that the animal(s) in question has the necessary TB, BR and BvD test recorded on the Department's database and that the keeper presenting the animal is not restricted by the Department. Certificates of Compliance can be obtained online from the Animal Identification and Movement (AIM) system through the www.agfood.ie facility or from the Cattle Movement Notification Agency. When applying for a Certificate of Compliance, keepers should not specify a destination.

On the day of the Show, the certificate of compliance should be presented to the Show Secretary along with the Bovine Passport for the animal. The keeper will then sign the Movement Notification section of the Certificate which will then be sent to the local DvO for recording on to the AIM system. Please note that only cattle for which a valid Certificate of Compliance is provided to the Show Secretary can be shown on the day of Show.

#### **RULES AND CONDITIONS**

- 1 Any person leading an animal must be competent to do so.
- 2. Animals over 6 weeks of age must have a valid T.B. Test.
- 3. An animal may be entered in more than one class, but a first prize winner at Show is debarred from competing in any subsequent class except in a class designed as a special class.
- No person will be allowed inside judging rings while judging is in progress, except Stewards in Charge, Judges and attendants immediately in charge of exhibit being judged.
- 5. Animals must be supervised at all times.
- 6. Officers of the Department of Agriculture will attend to check animals against accompanying veterinary documents. All necessary documents must be produced on show day for inspection.
- 7. Departmental Rules request that all animals be double tagged.
- 8. No pedigree cattle allowed to be shown in Commercial Classes.
- 9. All cattle to be led, unless otherwise stated.
- 10. Officers/Stewards of Bannow & Rathangan Show Society reserve the right to remove any animal that is considered a Health & Safety risk.
